At SUNY Farmingdale, the safety and well being of our students, faculty, staff, and visitors is our utmost priority. Our campus is a safe one. However, common sense and a few tips on protecting yourself and your property can go a long way. Please read through the information below prepared by our own University Police. If you have any questions, you can always reach the University Police at 631-420-2112. Our offices are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Safety and Security Services you should know about:

Motor Patrol: University Police patrol the campus 24 hours a day

First Aid: University Police have trained EMTs on staff

Emergency Telephones: Blue Light Phones link directly to University Police and can be found around the campus, both inside buildings and on the property. Pick up the phone and request assistance.

Electronic Alarm Systems: University Police monitor an extensive network of intrusion detection, panic, and fire alarm systems.

Motorist Assistance: University Police can help with minor vehicle problems. Call 631-420-2112.

Anonymous Tips Hotline: If you see anything suspicious on campus or believe that any student, faculty, or staff member is in danger you can call this number 24 hours a day. It is the responsibility of all members of the SUNY Farmingdale community to protect each other. Call 631-420-2768.

Recommended Safety Precautions

Personal Safety

Certain common sense procedures should be followed while on campus.

- * Do not walk alone after dark without a friend or escort.
- * If a situation arises where you feel your safety is compromised, call University Police immediately and they will escort you to your residence hall or car.
- * If you see anyone suspicious on campus, report it immediately to University Police.
- * If you see problems with the campus facilities such as broken locks, windows or lighting that is not working properly, report it immediately to Physical Plant staff at 631-420-2017.

As members of the campus community, you are urged to secure your valuables and be aware of your surroundings at all times. To assist in this endeavor, University Police hold education programs each semester on a variety of topics including personal safety awareness, rape awareness, sexual assertiveness training, operation ID, and anti-theft programs. Car Safety

Most of our students, 92%, are commuters and bring cars to the campus. To protect your car:

- * Always lock the doors
- * Park as close to the buildings as possible
- * Store valuable items in your trunk
- * Do not leave possessions lying around in your car
- * Make sure that your alarm system is working properly

Property Safety

While you are in classrooms, the library, common buildings or offices follow these simple tips:

- * Do not leave your purse, backpack, or laptop unprotected.
- * Take your possessions with you if you are leaving to go to class, the bathroom, or even to talk to a friend a few tables away.
- * Make sure your name is in all your possessions.
- * Write down the serial number of your laptop, cell phone
- * If you are a resident student, make sure your room is always locked.

Residence Halls

While there are many safeguards in place to protect students in residence halls, each student must do his or her part to ensure a safe and secure environment by adhering to the safety related policies and procedures in the Student Handbook.

Entrance to the Residence Halls is limited to SUNY Farmingdale students with approved magnetic cards. These cards must be used to gain access to the halls. Students should not allow other students to follow them into the dorms unless they are 100% sure that the person is an approved residence hall student. Visitors must follow the strict procedures outlined in the Student Life Handbook. Only matriculated residence students are allowed to live in the residence halls. If a student knows or suspects that there is a student living in the residence halls illegally, he or she must report it to the Residence Director. This is for the protection of all residence students.
