The Registrar's Office is located on the ground floor of Gleeson Hall for the first week of classes.

If you are a non-matriculated student adding or dropping a class (or registering), the Registrar's Office has the forms. If you are a matriculated (degree-seeking) student, you should pick up add/drop or registration forms at your department chair's office since you must obtain the chair-person's signature before changing your schedule or registering.

If you need to request a copy of your transcript, stop by the Registrar's Office with your student ID. Your student copy is free; official copies cost \$5. Fill out a Transcript Request Form to indicate where your records are to be sent.

DIRECTIONS VIA AUTOMOBILE:

Northern State Parkway —
Take the parkway to exit 40S — Route 110.
Travel south on Route 110 for approximately 3 miles.
The main entrance to the college will be on the right.
Please Note: All vehicles parked on campus must have a valid parking permit. Temporary parking permits are available at University Police Headquarters.

Southern State Parkway —
Take the parkway to exit 32N — Route 110.
Travel north on Route 110 for approximately 3 miles.
The main entrance to the college will be on the left.

Long Island Expressway (495) —
Take the LIE to exit 49 — Route 110.
Travel south on Route 110 for approximately 2 miles.
The main entrance to the College will be on the right.
