

New York State law requires all students born **on or after January 1, 1957**, who attend an institution of higher education, to provide proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella (MMR).

Proof of Immunity is as follows:

**Measles:** Proof of two measles immunizations administered after one year of age and at least one month apart; OR physician documentation confirming a history of measles disease; OR a laboratory blood test (titer) showing positive immunity to measles. *A copy of the laboratory (titer) report must be submitted.*

**Mumps:** Proof of one mumps immunization administered after one year of age; OR physician documentation confirming a history of mumps disease; OR a laboratory blood test (titer) showing positive immunity to mumps. *A copy of the laboratory (titer) report must be submitted.*

**Rubella:** Proof of one rubella immunization administered after one year of age; or a laboratory blood test (titer) showing positive immunity to rubella. Physician documentation of disease is NOT acceptable for rubella. *A copy of the laboratory (titer) report must be submitted.*

New York State law also requires that all students read and complete an informational form regarding Meningococcal Meningitis and the meningitis vaccine. This form must be completed in its entirety and returned to the Health and Wellness Center.

**Note: Residential students living on campus are required to receive the meningitis immunization.** Acceptable forms of immunization include:

Vaccine Type	Protects Against	Requirements	Dosing
<b>Men ACYW</b> (Menactra, Menveo, MenQuadfi)	Serogroups A,C,Y,W	1 dose within the last 5 years	1 dose or booster if > than 5 years old
<b>MenB</b> (Bexsero, Trumeba)	Serogroup B	Full Series (2-3 doses)	Bexsero: 2 doses 6 mo apart Trumeba: 2 doses 6 mo apart (3 if high risk)

Acceptable documentation includes: an official immunization record from a healthcare provider or clinic (**must be signed or stamped**); official immunization records from a high school, college, or university; military immunization records; or laboratory titer results demonstrating immunity.
