

Results from the 2015-16 Graduating Seniors Survey

This report summarizes the opinions of graduating seniors regarding their experiences while attending Farmingdale State College, as well as their intended post-graduation plans.

Methodology

The Office of Institutional Research, in conjunction with the Office of the Dean of Students, administered the Graduating Seniors Survey during commencement ticket distribution in December 2015 and May 2016. Students who were expected to fulfill their degree requirements over the summer were permitted to attend May commencement, and therefore, were surveyed in May 2016.

914 surveys were completed, which represents 48% of actual graduates. The distribution of survey respondents was fairly close to the distribution of actual graduates (appendix A).

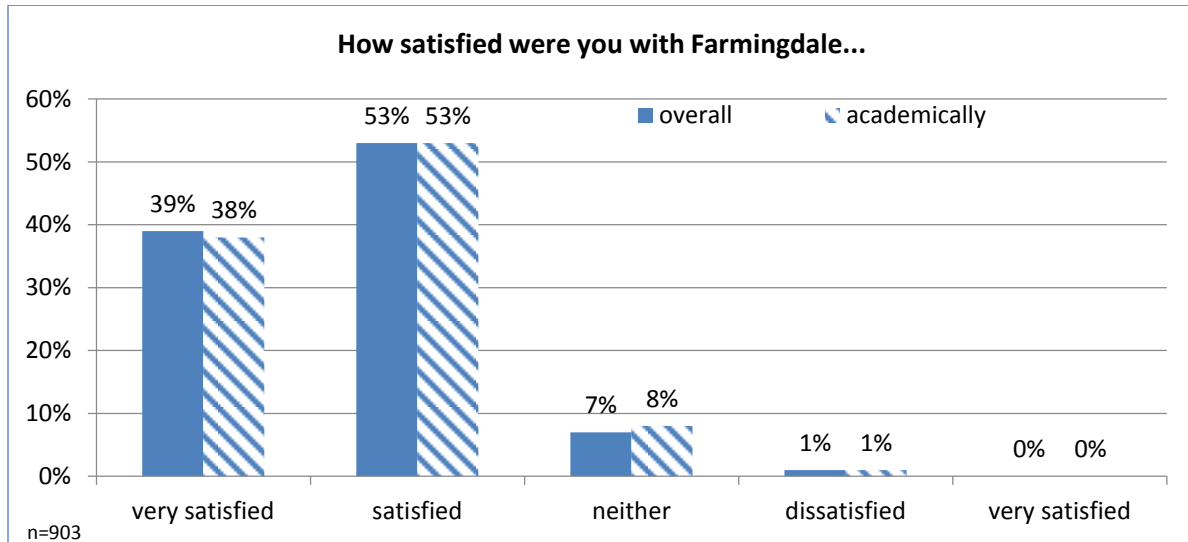
Highlights

- The vast majority of graduating seniors were either very satisfied or satisfied with their experience at Farmingdale overall (92%) and academically (91%).
- More than three-quarters (77%) of seniors graduating with a baccalaureate degree plan to look for employment after graduation while 35% of seniors graduating with an associate degree, plan to look for employment.
- Less than one-half (42%) of seniors graduating with a baccalaureate degree plan to continue their education.
 - Among the graduating seniors planning to continue their education, most of those receiving a baccalaureate degree from Farmingdale will continue on to pursue a masters or MBA degree. The most common field of study is Business. While one-quarter are undecided as to where they will study next, the named institution where the largest percentage of respondents plan to study is Stony Brook University.
- 78% of seniors graduating with an associate degree plan to continue their education.
 - Among the graduating seniors planning to continue their education, most of those receiving an associate degree from Farmingdale will continue on to pursue a baccalaureate degree and most plan to continue their education at Farmingdale. Respondents planning to attend an institution other than Farmingdale for their baccalaureate degree appear to be doing so because the program that they want is not offered here.
- When asked what they liked best about Farmingdale, faculty, by far, topped the list. Academics, campus atmosphere/environment, location/commute/convenience, and class size all made the top five.
- The top five things that respondents cited they liked least about Farmingdale were; parking, some faculty, lack of social life/interaction/school spirit, availability of courses/class schedules, and academics.

Survey Findings

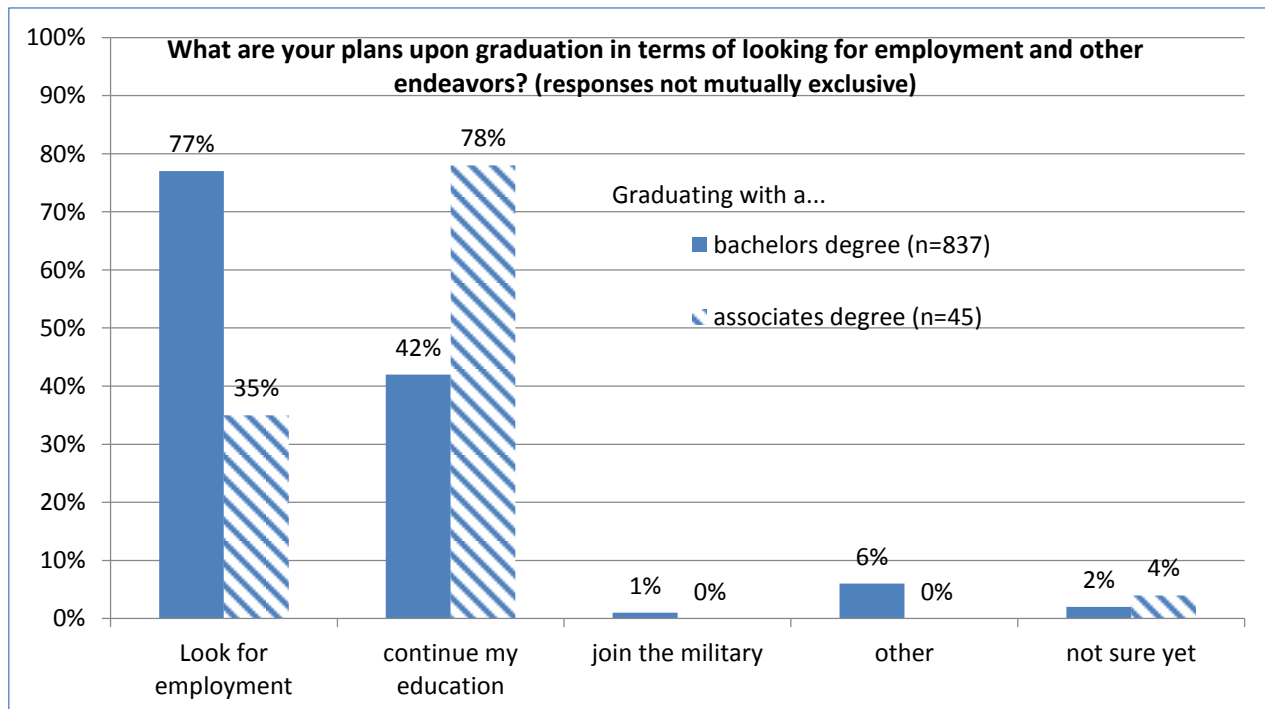
Satisfaction

The vast majority of graduating seniors were either very satisfied (92%) or satisfied (91%) with their experience at Farmingdale overall and academically.



Post-Graduation Plans

More than three-quarters (77%) of seniors graduating with a baccalaureate degree plan to look for employment after graduation and less than one-half (42%) will continue their education. Conversely, 35% of seniors graduating with an associate degree, plan to look for employment and 78% plan to continue their education.

Seniors Graduating from FSC with a Baccalaureate Degree

Among the graduating seniors planning to continue their education, 79% of those receiving a baccalaureate degree from Farmingdale will continue on to pursue a masters or MBA degree. The most common field of study is Business (appendix B1). While one-quarter are undecided as to where they will study next, the named institution where the largest percentage of respondents plan to study is Stony Brook University (appendix C1).

Seniors Graduating from FSC with an Associate Degree

Among the graduating seniors planning to continue their education, 84% of those receiving an associate degree from Farmingdale will continue on to pursue a baccalaureate degree. The most frequently cited field of study is Dental Hygiene (appendix B2). Approximately 40% of respondents plan to continue their education at Farmingdale (appendix C2). Respondents planning to attend an institution other than Farmingdale for their baccalaureate degree appear to be doing so because the program that they want is not offered here.

Likes and Dislikes

Graduating seniors offered extensive comments when asked ‘what did you like best about Farmingdale?’ and ‘what did you like least about Farmingdale?’ The faculty was, by far, what graduating seniors liked most about Farmingdale. Their biggest complaint was parking.
