JOHNSON IS HOOTED AFTER RESIGNATION

FARMINGDALE, Dec. 19.—When word was received here of the resignation of Director Albert A. Johnson, townspeople and residents of the country for miles around joined students of the State Institute of Applied Agriculture here in celebrating, at Johnson's expense, the realization of their protracted fight to oust him as head of the agricultural institution.

A crowd of approximately 100 men gathered outside of Johnson's cottage, adjoining the school grounds, and with the aid of automobile horns and various other noise generators voiced in a weird bedlam their approval of the board of directors' acceptance of Johnson's withdrawal. Johnson, who was within, did not come out and the demonstration continued for several minutes. The students invoked customary academic antics in otherwise registering their satisfaction.
